The art of Rabbit “Ellis” Knows His Gun and his son Allen is the primary exhibit at the Goodland Arts Center for October.

Rabbit portrays traditional Plains Indian life and culture in his paintings, with a particular focus on the Crow. His themes include nature and the environment domestic life and evangelical Catholic perspectives of Christian spirituality.

His book, “The Inspirational Art of Rabbit Knows His Gun,” contains prints of many of the works displayed, and is on sale at the center.

Allen Knows His Gun puts a modern twist on his father’s more traditional style with a mixture of impressionism and realism. He uses vivid colors with vibrant light

and shadow to capture the life of the Plains Indians.

Virginia lawyer, state at odds over blog

RICHMOND, Va. (AP) – A Richmond lawyer says the Virginia State Bar violated his free-speech rights when it told him to put an advertising disclaimer on his blog.

The bar charged Horace Frazier Hunter with misconduct after he refused last year to put the disclaimer on the blog.

The *Richmond Times Dispatch* (<http://bit.ly/pOA2sd>) reports that a public disciplinary hearing is scheduled Tuesday.

Hunter’s blog is on his law firm’s website. The bar contends that the website’s purpose is to market the law firm and the blog is part of an advertisement.
