

Middle school A-team wins

The Golden Plains Middle School girls split games at Tribune on Oct. 20 as the A-team girls won in two matches and the B-team girls lost in three very close matches. The C-team also had an opportunity to play, winning in two sets.

The A-team easily won the first set 25-12.

"The girls passed the ball very well. Kami Miller served 7 consecutive points – three of them ace serves," Coach Ashley Arnberger said. "Kynndra Rush also had 5 ace serves."

In the second set, the Greeley County Panthers rallied a bit, but the Lady Bulldogs played strong to win 25-18.

"Tribune returned the ball more than in set one and we had several good rallies," Arnberger continued. "Kami served 8 consecutive points with 4 of them ace serves."

"The games were definitely worth the long ride to Tribune," Maddy Walz added. "It was probably the best the A-team has ever passed. We worked hard and did what we knew we could."

In the B-team game, the girls won the first set with a close 25-21 score. They lost the second set, forcing the score to 26-28. The third set was also close, but the final score fell short for the Lady Bulldogs as they lost 15-17.

"The girls played extremely hard and competed until the very end," Arnberger said. "This was a tough loss for the girls but this match really showed the improvements they have made

throughout the season."

"This was a very good way to end the volleyball season," seventh grader Arianna Comacho said,

"Everybody on the team has improved a lot since the beginning," Gabrielle Schiltz added,

"I am very proud of the way we played and how we have worked as a team," Carmen Sepulveda continued.

The C-team girls gained experience and got a sweet taste of victory while competing in close games as they won in two sets 25-17 and 26-24.

"It was great to have three full matches our last time out," Arnberger said. "All of the girls got to play a lot of volleyball. We only played one true C-team match this year against Greeley County. A few other times we played a third set as a C team. The combined B and C team record for this season was 5 wins and 3 losses."

These games marked the end of the middle school volleyball regular season. Their last time on the floor was at the Freedom League Tournament in Brewster on Oct. 25. The A-team girls entered the tournament with a 6-2 record.

"I'm very happy with how this season went, and I can't wait until the league tournament," Brianna Stoll said. "I have great confidence that we will do very well."

No. 13 Kansas wins ugly exhibition game

LAWRENCE – The only assist Tyshawn Taylor could deliver Tuesday night was helpful advice to freshman Naadir Tharpe.

Outside shooter Elijah Johnson was way outside the 3-point line – he spent the whole night on the Kansas bench. Thomas Robinson could only watch fellow big man Jeff Withey log a quiet triple-double with 18 points, 12 rebounds and 10 blocks while starting in his place.

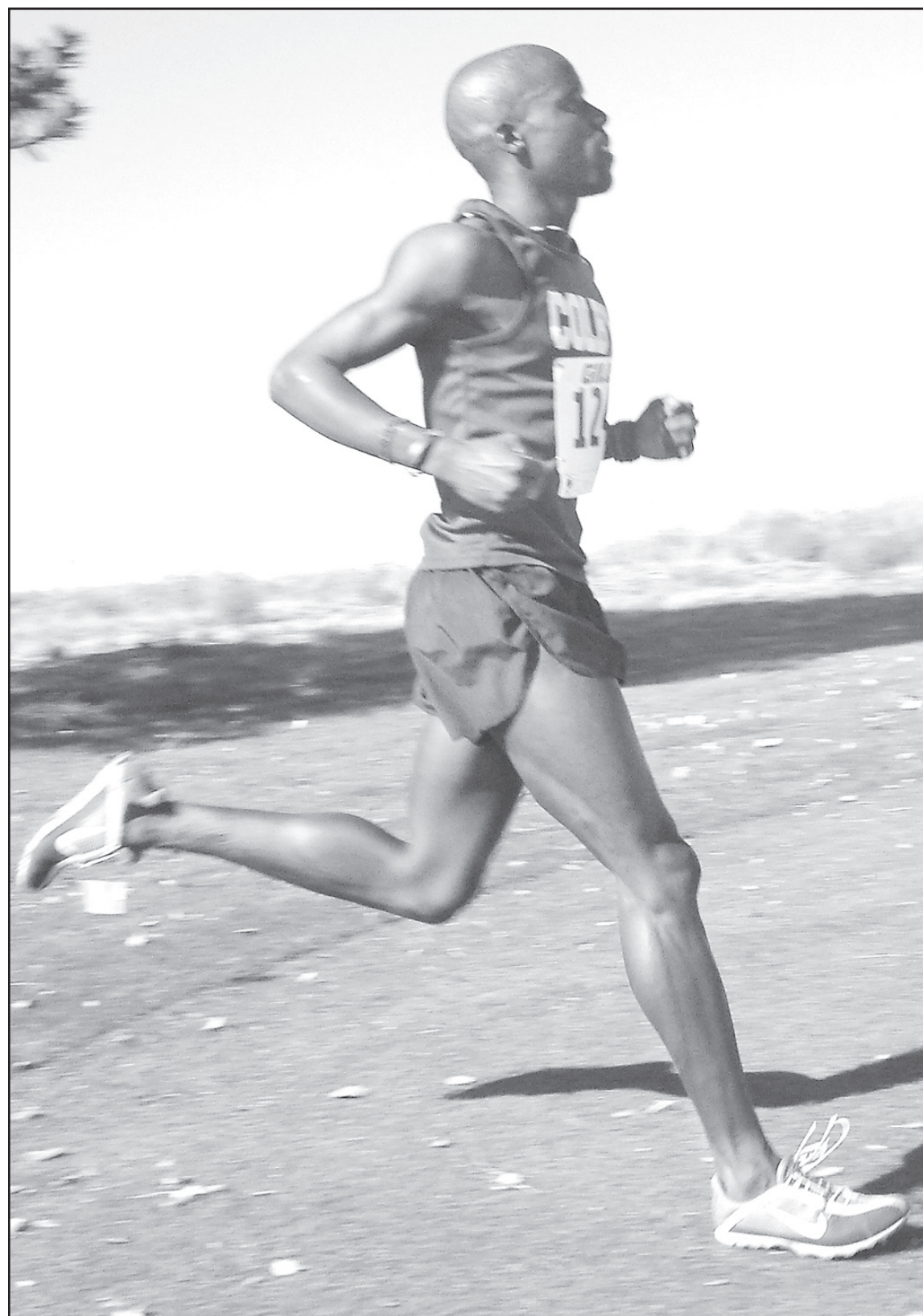
With three of their best players out due to injury and suspension, the No. 13 Jayhawks slogged their way to an 84-55 exhibition win

over Pittsburg State.

Connor Teahan, the team's expected sixth man, hit five 3-pointers and finished with 21 points for Kansas, which is picked to win the Big 12 for the eighth straight season despite losing twins Marcus and Markieff Morris, Josh Selby and a host of other players from a 35-3 team a year ago.

Self suspended Taylor, the team's leading returning scorer, and Johnson, its best outside shooter, for Kansas' two exhibition games for violating unspecified team rules during the off-season. They're expected back for the regular-season opener Nov. 11 against Towson.

Trojan cross country runner wins regional championship

The Colby Community College men's cross country team finished in third place in the Region VI Championships held Monday in Garden City.

Edward Limo, Kenya, won the individual title with a time of 25:38.20 for the 8K race. Raymond Velazquez, San Antonio, Texas, finished in sixth with a time of 26:58.30.

Juan Pacheco Orozco, Mexico, was 19th with 27:32.60. Ivan Villanueva, Mission, Texas, was close behind with a 21st-place finish of 27:36:50.

Other competitors include Damarius Lowery, Houston, Texas, 28:06.80; Devon McCormick, Colorado Springs, Colo., 28:30.20; Tim Cude, Bridge City, Texas, 29:04.80; Hansel Ibarra, Mission, Texas, 29:30.50; James Leonard, Crosby, Texas, 29:47.70.

Limo and Velazquez earned All-Region honors. The team repeated last year's results by finishing third in the Region and second in the Jayhawk Conference West.

"We are extremely disappointed with the way the race turned out," said Head Coach James Ortiz. "We just had a bad day. Even if we'd finished in second place, we would have been disappointed."

"Edward and Raymond had fantastic races, but it takes more than two good performances to win a title," said Ortiz. "Regionals are in the past and our new focus is Nationals. We want to show the country that we are better than what we showed at Garden City."

Many of the conference competitors Colby will face at Nationals are nationally ranked, along with the Trojans.

Garden City Community College is first in the national rankings. Colby is ranked fourth, Johnson County Community College is eighth, Butler County Community College is 17th, Allen County Community College is 21st and Hutchinson is 22nd. The other Jayhawk schools are not ranked.

The national competition is Saturday, Nov. 12, in Hobbs, N.M.
