# Waffle iron has sticky problems

Dear Heloise: I have a WAFFLE IRON with removable nonstick plates. The plates have a buildup of cooking spray, oil, etc., that has rendered them no longer "nonstick," and I have tried numerous methods to remove the gunk. Nothing has worked. Do you have any suggestions? -Walt B., via email

Yes, I do! Of course, you should follow the manufacturer's directions first.

Here's the Heloise hint: Soak a paper towel or napkin with sudsing ammonia (it has detergent in it) and place between the waffle-iron grids. Leave it for several hours (out of the way) or overnight. Then, use a little dish soap and hot water with a nonabrasive, scrub-type sponge or plastic brush. Rinse well, and dry completely. To re-season your waffle iron, if needed, take

pieces of bread, coat with unsalted shortening or unsalted butter and place one in each section of the cooled iron. Close the lid and then turn it on. Cook until the bread is browned, then take it out, wipe and that's it! Heloise Update: Lecithin, found in many cook-

ing-oil sprays, leaves a gummy residue when sprayed on a HOT surface. DON'T spray oil on a hot griddle. This should help prevent any future buildup. - Heloise

Dear Heloise: The lady who recently wrote that she is always having to throw away half-used cartons of milk because she doesn't drink it fast enough should buy organic milk. It lasts a long time. Check the dates in the store, and you will see. Why does it last longer? I have no idea. - A Reader, North Little Rock, Ark.

How right you are, and thanks for reminding us. Ultrapasteurization and packaging are the reasons organic milk has such a long shelf life. A major manufacturer of organic milk offers both pasteurized and ultrapasteurized milk. The pasteurized has a shelf life of one to two weeks, compared with the ultrapasteurized, with a sellby date several weeks out. There are single servings of organic milk that

keep at room temperature and have an extended \[ \bigcup \] shelf life. - Heloise

P.S.: Also, lactose-free milk (whole, 2 percent or fat-free) has a longer life, too!


#### **KEEPING INVENTORY**

## **First Things First**

It isn't difficult to make six spades on this deal if you see the opposing cards. Declarer takes the opening club lead with the ace, leads a low spade and lets it ride if East follows low, then later takes a winning heart finesse to bring home the slam.

But when the opposing hands are not known, making the slam is a much more complicated proposition. If, for example, West held the king of hearts, declarer should not tackle the trump suit in the fashion described above because he could no longer afford to lose a trump trick. Since in practice declarer cannot see the de-

fenders' cards, he should adopt the method of play that offers the best chance of success. In some cases, he will go down no matter what he does. Thus, if the East-West hands in the actual deal are exchanged, South cannot prevail. The correct approach is to postpone the de-

cision on how to play the spades until declarer knows whether he has to lose a heart trick. Accordingly, South leads a heart from dummy at trick two and takes the finesse. If the finesse fails, by far the best remaining hope is to cash the spade ace, hoping to drop the


singleton king. But if the heart finesse succeeds, declarer has a sure thing. All he has to do is to make certain he does not lose two trump tricks. This can be accomplished easily by crossing to dummy with a diamond to lead a low spade.

South then adapts his play to whatever card East plays. If East shows out on the first spade, declarer takes the ace and returns a spade toward the

queen to limit himself to one trump loser. If East produces a spade honor instead, South takes the ace and is home free. And if East follows to the first spade with the three, declarer finesses to assure the loss of only one trump trick.
