The Colby Community College men's basketball team set a school record for points scored in a Jayhawk Conference game, defeating Pratt Community College 110-81 at the Community Building on Wednesday.

Red-hot shooting all night helped the Trojans maintain a considerable lead throughout the contest. The men shot 50 percent from the field and 55 percent from the three-point

Colby's bench was instrumental in the win. Roman Szymanski, James Davenport, John Clarke, Scott Ochs, Chaz Sharp and Mitchell Ackerman all played a big role scoring a combined 42 points in Colby's best performance of the year.

The Trojans led from the start, building a 17-point lead at the half. It was more of the same in the second half with the Trojans scoring 61 points. The team also controlled the boards, out-rebounding Pratt 50-31.

'We truly played team basketball with 30 of our 40 field goals being scored from assists," said Head Coach Dustin Pfeifer. "We really needed to play well last night. We needed to prove that we are capable of fighting through adversity and bouncing back from our worst performance of the year against Barton last Wednesday.
