Committee rejects funding

TOPEKA (AP) - A Kansas House committee has rejected a request from public broadcasters to restore \$800,000 in funding. Gov. Sam Brownback's budget

proposal included \$600,000 for public broadcasting, a cut from the current \$2 million state appropriation.

A House budget subcommittee restored \$800,000. But Thursday, the full House Appropriations Committee removed that \$800,000 and returned the state appropriation to \$600,000 for the next fiscal year.
