Garden City (6-6, 18-8) fell behind for much of the second half, trailing by as much as 8, but it mounted

The Broncbusters brought the score to 67-63 with 3:21 left on the clock. Both teams missed their shots until Colby got one to fall with 1:20 left. Garden City made their own basket just 24 seconds later to keep

The Broncbusters committed two fouls and the Trojans committed one foul in the next 30 seconds, putting the score at 71-66.

With less than 20 seconds left in the game, Marty Wendel and Kristan Rolle missed four free throws combined and Garden City missed 2 three-point shots. The clock ran out in the Trojans' hands with the score still at 71-66.

"This was one of the best environments in all of junior college basketball. Our team really needed to play well tonight and the energy in the gym was incredible. Our guys really responded to the atmosphere," said Pfeifer.

Carson Konrade led in scoring with 21 points. He made 5 three-point baskets and 7 of 11 from the field. He also pulled down 7 rebounds and had 1 steal.

Vincent Dillard followed with 11 points, 3 rebounds and 3 assists. Chaz Sharp finished the game currently 4-7 in the Conference and 8-17 overall. with 8 points, 3 rebounds, 2 assists and 2 steals, Rolle had 8 points and 7 rebounds and Wendel had 8 points, coming from 4 of 7 field goals, 4 rebounds, 1 assist and 1 steal.
