



Dear Dr. Brothers: My son is in kindergarten, and he hasn't been doing well. The teacher tells me he is aggressive and hostile, and I was hoping he would have grown out of this stage. Ever since he was a toddler, he's been a difficult child who I have had to battle all day long. I don't know how to make him behave. I have always had a hard time being nice to him because he was difficult and we didn't get along. Is this my fault? – G.M.

Dear G.M.: I am not here to blame you, but it is likely that your parenting style has had a significant effect on how your son behaves, especially if he shows anger and opposition. How he acts with his teacher and classmates is an extension of interacting with you. If you showed a lot of anger and punitive intent in your interactions with him, he learned to respond in an angry way. Maybe it worked and maybe it didn't, but the stage was set for his behavior when he got to school. Now you may find it wise to become a more calm and accepting parent, with appropriate limits and correction when he goes into his routine.

The first months of a baby's life are just as crucial as the "terrible twos" or any stage - so says a study by researchers at the University of Minnesota, reported in the journal Child Development. If children are parented in a negative style while toddlers, the study concluded, they are likely to develop anger, which will translate into behavior issues when they start school. But it is never too late to change your parenting style, and there are plenty of resources to help you to do it.


Dear Dr. Brothers: I am a single mom trying to raise two kids. My 4-year-old has been a great helper since my son was born, but now he is walking, she seems tired of him. I think she thought of him as a doll before, and now he is hard to dress. She cries and refuses to help me, where she used to have fun. Do you think I should give up and get a neighborhood kid to help me? - L.W.

Dear L.W.: It sounds as though you are overwhelmed by the responsibilities that go with raising two children under 5 years old. You may have taken your 4-year-old down a path that is not appropriate for her. It's great to have a big sister be a helper if she wants to be - not to avoid hiring help, but to allow your children an opportunity to bond with each other and you. You probably have taught your daughter skills that will be useful as she grows, but her attitude shows it may have been too much work and too little fun for her.

When your oldest child starts school, she probably will be a responsible and capable student, but if you keep trying to make her work for you, she could find herself burnt out when it comes time to share, or put away toys, or clean up her space. I'm sure you don't want that to happen. So by all means, hire a baby sitter and take your daughter out for some fun with Mom, and do the same for your son as he gets older. Your daughter eventually will find him a good playmate, and will resume her role as a helpful big sister.



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#### What Can Defeat Me?

A surprisingly large number of players show a lack of respect for safety plays. What is particularly annoying about this attitude is that their casual disrespect usually doesn't cost them a blessed farthing because the remote situation that they should be trying to protect against seldom 23 occurs.

However, lightning sometimes does strike, and when that happens, these players often wind up bemoaning their fate. For example, consider this deal where South gets to six spades and sees – or should see - that the only way the slam can be lost is if he loses two trump tricks.

So, instead of dismissing this "remote" possibility, South should instead concentrate all his thoughts on how to overcome a 4-0 trump division, if that unlikely distribution happens to exist.

Accordingly, he should win the diamond lead in dummy and return a low trump. When East follows with the six, South should play the seven, being perfectly willing to lose the trick to the nine, ten or queen in order to assure the slam beyond the shadow of a doubt.

In the actual deal, the safety play pays off, and South avoids going down one. Playing the ace on the first trump lead would be correct if East produced the nine, ten or queen at trick two, or if East showed out on the first trump lead. In all of these cases, South could then limit himself to either one trump loser or none with proper play. (In the actual case, if East played the nine or ten, South would next lead a spade to the jack and later finesse against East to hold himself to one trump loser.)

This frame of mind - where declarer hopes for the best but prepares for the worst – is often crucial to achieving a winning result. There is no good reason to incur an unfavorable outcome that could have been avoided.
