GENERAL NOTICE TO CONTROL NOXIOUS WEEDS

The Kansas Noxious Weed Law K.S.A. 2-1314 et seg requires all persons who own or supervise land in Kansas to control and eradicate all weeds declared noxious by legislative action. The weeds declared noxious are: field bindweed, musk thistle. sericea lespedeza, johnson grass, bur ragweed, Canada thistle, leafy spurge, hoary cress, quack grass, Russian knapweed

Notice is hereby given pursuant to the Kansas Noxious Weed Law to every person who owns or supervises land in Thomas County that noxious weeds growing or found on such land shall be controlled and eradicated. Control is defined as preventing the production of viable seed and the vegetative spread of the plant.

Failure to observe this notice may result in the County:

1. Serving a legal notice requiring control of the noxious weeds within a minimum of five days. Failure to control the noxious weeds within the time period allowed may result in the county treating the noxious weeds at the landowners expense and not paid within 30 days or,

2. Filing criminal charges for non compliance. Conviction for non compliance may result in a fine of \$ 100 per day of noncompliance with a maximum fine of \$

The public is also hereby notified that it is a to barter, sell or give away infested nursery stock or livestock feed unless the feed is fed on the farm where grown or sold to a commercial processor that will destroy the viability of the noxious weed seed. Custom harvesting machines must be labeled with a label provided by the Kansas Dept. of Agriculture and must be free of all weed seed and litter when entering the State and when leaving a field infested with noxious weeds. "News will now be sent via email, allowing you to receive immediate notification of program news that is pertinent to your agricultural operation."

Through the GovDelivery electronic news service, anyone can establish subscriber preferences by choosing to receive federal farm program information by topic, by state and or by county. Subscribers can select as many options as they want, which allows producers who farm in multiple counties or across state lines to receive updates from each county in which they operate or have an interest.

Farm Service will automatically subscribe farmers and ranchers when they provide their e-mail address to the local office.

Those interested in receiving information through e-mail can subscribe to GovDelivery online at www.fsa.usda.gov/subscribe. After you enter your e-mail address, click on "+" next to "Updates for State and County." Scroll down and click on "+" next to "Kansas," select the counties which you have an interest and click on "Submit" at the bottom of the page. Note that there are other options available that provide national information by topic through e-mail.
