The Hornell Evening Tribune reports (bit.ly/Igj1Du) that Steuben County Public Works Commissioner Vince Spagnoletti wants to put goats and sheep to work trimming the grass at the Bath landfill.

He figures letting the ruminants roam the 32-acre site about 60 miles south of Rochester could save about \$5,000 a year in labor, equipment and gas.
