Assume you're in three notrump and West leads his fourth-best heart, the deuce. You win East's
queen with the king, and you see only seven sure queen with the king, and you see only seven sure
winners -- one spade, one heart, three diamonds and two clubs.
There are several ways to try to acquire one or
wo more tricks. The jack of diamonds might fall if you cash the A-K-Q, making your ten a trick; you might gain a trick by taking a spade finesse;
and you might gain two tricks if the clubs are diand you might gain two tricks if the clubs are di-
vided 3-2 and East has the queen. vided 3-2 and East has the queen. No harm can come from first cashing the A-K of diamonds. When you do, both defenders follow clubs, leading the deuce to the ace and a low club clubs, leading tast shows out, your chances in that suit go down the drain.
