

Colby baseball team remains undefeated

The Colby High varsity baseball team is still undefeated, winning two nonconference games against Liberal, 5-4 and 10-5, at the city ball fields.

The wins April 19 gave the Eagles a 6-0 record in the Great West Activities Conference and 10-0 overall.

On the mound in game one was Luke Cox, who got his fourth win of the season. He threw 7 strikeouts and allowed 4 runs, 3 hits and 4 walks

"Luke got into a some trouble in the second inning because he lost the strike zone and walked three guys, and then we committed a couple of errors to allow them to score 3 runs," Coach Rick Williams said. "It is important for a pitcher to throw strikes and pitch to contact and keep his defense in the game, but Luke got

hiccups in the third inning, Luke and our defense settled in and cruised from there."

At the plate, Colby had just 4 hits coming from Jordan Rasmussen, Cox, Braden Sager, who had a double and batted in 2 runs, and Troy Quenzer.

"This was a very close game that was tied or found us behind for most of it," Williams said, "but again, our pitching and defense kept us in the game and we were able to come up with a couple of late runs to take the lead and claim the victory. Liberal is a talented young team and our experience and toughness were a big part of this victory."

Game two was a little easier for the Eagles, with better performances at bat.

Williams said Sager pitched a complete game to earn his third win. He threw 2 strikeouts and allowed 5 runs, 4 hits and 6 walks. The boys committed 3 errors.

"Offensively, we had multi-hit games from Rasmussen, Organ and (Trek) Keck," Williams said. "Braden Sager had a big 2-run triple in the sixth to break the game wide open. After struggling at the plate last week, it was nice to see our offensive production go up this week against Goodland and Liberal.'

Rasmussen hit a double and a triple to bring in 2 runs, Sager brought in 2 runs from his triple, Keck had a double and 1 run batted in and Organ knocked in 2 runs.

The varsity will compete in the Hays High tournament Thursday through Saturday before heading into the final week of the regular season
