If you think he sounds a little upset, irritated, maybe even angry, about that map, you could be right. It's difficult enough to

The leadership's map, known as Ad Astra, would take away two counties on the southeast corner of the district - Ness and Trego - and add four to the northeast – Phillips, Smith, Jewell and Osborne, plus half of Hamilton on the southwest.

It would stretch the district two-thirds of the way to Oklahoma at the Colorado line and a county into the east near Nebraska. At 20 counties, he'd have about one-fifth of the state's area.

"It's awful," he said, adding that the map by Sen. Abrams would have added two counties, but keep his district compact off. and nearly square.
