Hutfles asked if there is any worry about making a hurried hire and Armstrong said no, because whether they choose someone in-house or out of house, she will make the best decision for the city.

Councilman Mark Beringer asked if Adrian would have any input in the decision and Armstrong said no, it is strictly her job or the manager's job. In other business, the council:

· Approved the job description for the city manager position, which was drafted by City Manager Carolyn Armstrong.

• Heard from Molly Oliver, real estate agent with Stock Realty, who wanted an extension for the Embark Building listing. The listing expires on Sunday but the council said there were still some things pending and Adrian said they would know about these things in a few weeks.

• Approved an agreement with the Colby Swim Club on a storage facility at the aquatic park. Armstrong said the club gave the council two options, but club wanted the second option, which involves using a Lester building. The club asked for a 10-year guarantee for their use of the building, and it also figured out

Colby native joins event to raise money for nonprofit

Breakthrough, having been involved for almost six years. It is by far my favorite charity to support, and I hope I can bring home that mirror ball trophy.'

Hills volunteers her time in the classroom reading stories, in art time, trips to the library and wherever she is needed. For four years, she has mentored a young girl who turns 14 on Saturday. She has also adopted families for Christmas, which is how she came to learn of the nonprofit.

Hills hopes people will join in her mission and vote for her as she performs with professional dance instructor Brandon White on Saturday, June 9, in Kansas City. The fourth annual Dancing with the Stars is a local fundraising event hosted by another Kansas City nonprofit organization, the Brian Anselmo Memorial Foundation, which donates all proceeds of the event to charities that resented by local celebrities like Hills. The event will not be publicly broadcasted, but will be filmed in front of a local audience of about 600 and then uploaded to YouTube. Hills has promised to e-mail links to her donors following the June performance. She takes the position of dancing Star No. 5, alongside six other couples. The event features judges Chelsie Hightower and Tony Dovolani, from ABC's Dancing with the Stars, who will also give a performance. The highest bidder will

win a dance with Hightower or Dovolani.

Although Hills danced on the high school drill team during her junior year in Topeka, she claims to have limited dance experience.

"Like anybody, I like to dance at the bar and at wedding receptions, but, I really have zero legitimate dance experience," she exclaimed.

So, she has been working hard and is glad to have a partner who makes dancing easy and fun. She'll be debuting her new-found skills during 'two hot minutes of the Cha Cha Cha" in a costume "covered in as many sequins and sparkles and fringe and feathers as possible."

And, since the fund raiser's record amount raised is \$15,000 from a school librarian who competed last year, Hills has set her goal at \$20,000. So far, she has raised about \$8,000, which will benefit Operation Breakthrough whether she wins or not.

"If my twice-weekly dance lessons have taught me anything, it is to accept help when it is ofwere close to Anselmo's heart and are being rep- fered," said Hills. "Each vote for me is \$10 and the star with the most votes wins the competition. People have so far been very generous, opening their hearts and their wallets.'
