"This is the biggest game he's ever played in and Saturday will be even bigger," Nuggets coach George Karl said of Lawson, whose 32 points were a careerplayoff high.

The decisive game is Saturday night at the Staples Center, Denver's first all-or-nothing showdown since losing to Utah in Game 7 of the 1994 Western Conference semifinals. But it would be a mistake to think the young team will cave under the pressure of a winor-go-home scenario.
