Overcrowded closets need spring cleaning

Crowding a closet with unused clothing can mean that freshly laundered, cleaned or pressed items will wrinkle before wearing, said Denise Dias, K-State Extension family and consumer sciences agent in Sedgwick County.

When hanging clothes in a closet, allow two to three inches between items to maintain their appearance, she said.

To clean a clothes closet, Dias recommends discarding:

- Clothing with a stain, hole, tear, missing buttons, damaged zipper or other closures that cannot be restored or repaired;
- Lingerie, other undergarments and socks that have worn thin or lost elasticity;
- Shoes that are worn and cannot be repaired or renewed; and,
- Worn-out weekend or chore clothes ready for the rag basket.

Donate:

- Clean clothing in good condition that is no longer your size or to your taste.

Accessories such as belts, purses or hats that are no longer used.

- A coat or coats that no longer fit (or will not fit over other clothing), and are not worn.
- Impulse purchases or sale items that don't work well with your wardrobe.

To further relieve crowding in closets, Dias recommended looking for other areas in the home (an un-used closet, utility room or storage containers designed to fit under the bed) to store out-of-season clothing.

Consulting home design books and browsing in container or storage departments can be a source of ideas, said Dias, who suggested storing belts, scarves or men's ties on a mug rack or towel bar attached to a closet wall or the backside of the door.

1958 postcard finally arrives

CHICAGO (AP) — A postcard mailed from Chicago in 1958 has finally reached its intended recipient, but not without a little help from Facebook.

The *Chicago Sun-Times* reports that a postcard depicting Shedd Aquarium recently arrived at Scott McMurry's Virginia home, more than five decades after his mom mailed it.

The 71-year-old says he immediately recognized his mother's handwriting.

The postcard was addressed to

Clairmont Lane in Decatur, Ga., where McMurry grew up. But it recently arrived in Elizabeth Fulcher's mailbox on Clairmont Lane in South Daytona, Fla.

Fulcher posted a picture of the postcard on Facebook and her friends helped track down McMurry.

The half-century mail delay remains a mystery.

In the meantime, the aquarium has offered to give him a tour of the attraction that his late parents visited.
