## Tractor and car show ready for 19th season

The 19th annual Antique Tractor and Classic Car show will be held in Selden on Sunday, June 3.

This annual event, hosted by the Selden Community Foundation, draws enthusiasts an opportunity to display their antique tractors, classic cars and small engines while enjoying a fun-filled day of family activities.

The day starts off at 9 a.m. with registration at the north end of Main Street. Exhibitors will line up their vehicles for spectators to enjoy throughout the day while a variety of activities take place in and around the city park.

The horseshoe pitching contest will begin at 10 a.m. on the south side of the tennis courts and a basketball free throw contest is planned for 12:30 p.m. for students in third through eighth grades. Other activities for the kids include rides in the barrel train, a free raffle and the corn tank filled with coins for ages 8 and under.

In the afternoon, the kiddie tractor pull for ages 5 to 10 will begin at 1 p.m. with trophies awarded

for first, second, and third places.

The adults will have a variety of activities as well. Along with the horseshoe pitching contest, there will be an antique baler demonstration, a barrel roll competition, and a washer drop contest. Tickets will be sold throughout the day for a drawing for a Case IH pedal tractor donated by Hoxie Implement, along with an all-terrain tricycle donated by Frank Bouts, a John Deere toy tractor donated by Taylor Implement and other prizes. The drawing will be just before the parade at 3 p.m.

Additional activities during the day include a meal of barbecue pork, hamburgers and fixings served by the Selden Community Foundation. There will be refreshments available from the Harvester's 4-H and other vendors in the park and vendors in the Selden Community Building. Musical entertainment will be provided in the park throughout lunch time by Rose Bainter and family.

seemingly impossible, he still emerged as a hero. He had the privilege of leading as many as 2 million people out of bondage and into freedom.

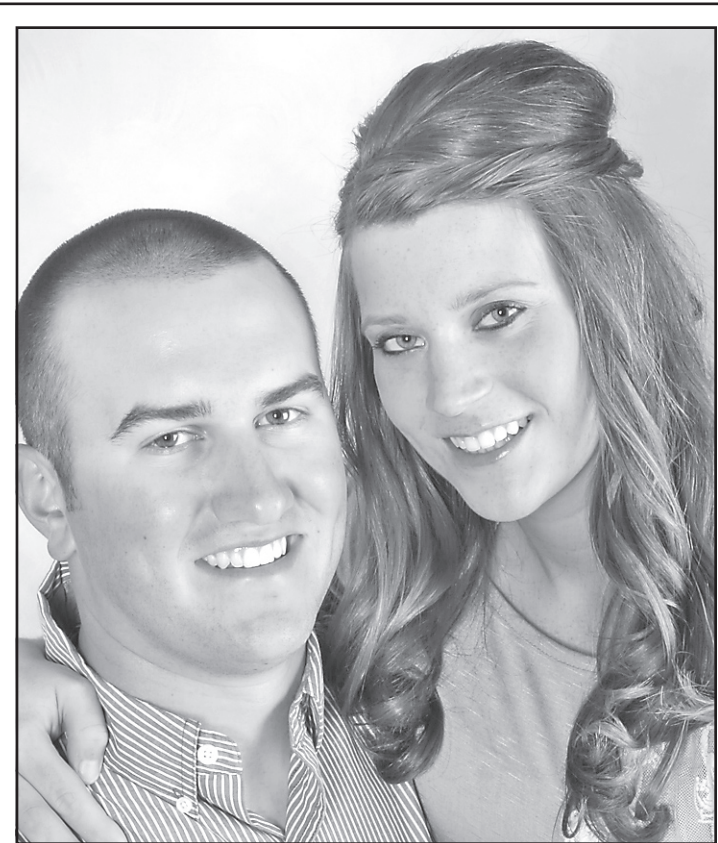
We all have opportunities to "lead" others, which may cause us to make excuses, just like Moses. We might think, "I'm not good enough" or "no one ever listens to me."

Doyle says she was bleeding and blacked out but is doing much better. She won't identify the dog's owner but says he agreed to take a campaign sign. Doyle calls it a "sympathy vote."
