In the freedom we experience, remember persecuted Christians

On one of our trips to India, an Indian Christian asked one of my colleagues an interesting question

He explained that being a Christian in India was very difficult, that persecution was common and that he had given up much because he was a Christian. Then he asked the question, "What do American Christians have to give up?" It was a difficult question to answer because the honest answer is: nothing.

We are blessed to live in a country which truly believes in freedom of religion. We take this for granted, and sometimes we forget that for most of human history, and in many parts of the world today, this is not the case. Somalia is one of those places.

According to an organization that monitors the persecution of Christians, Somalia is second only to North Korea as the worst persecutor of Christians. Voice of the Martyrs reports, "For more than two decades Somalia has suffered from civil war. Unsuccessful treaties and resolutions among various warring factions have rendered the nation a 'failed state' in the eyes of the international community ... and Christians are targeted by all of the factions head with the butt of his rifle, knocking him fighting for control."

The group that poses the greatest danger is Al-Shabab. Al-Shabab means "the youth" in going on arriving in time to see one of the men Arabic. Voice of the Martyrs reports that when Christians are discovered by Al-Shabab, they are sometimes beheaded on the spot. Al-Shabab members have even crossed the border and killed fleeing Christians in the refugee camps of Ethiopia.

One morning in 2007, Diya, a Somali Christian, and his youngest son were sitting in front of their house reading the Bible when a group of men from what is known as the Islamist Courts Union passed by. Diya and his son went into the house, but they had noticed that Diya was reading the Bible.

They knocked on the door. Diya answered As he did so, one of the men hit him on the unconscious. His son started crying. Diya's wife ran into the main room to see what was

The authorities tried to make an arrest in this case. The object of their investigation was Diya, not his attackers. His crime? Owning a Bible. Possessing a piece of Christian literature is a capital offense in Somalia. It took the intercession of his tribal leaders to prevent his arrest.

Today Diya continues to maintain a remarkable faith. He mourns the death of his son and wife, and he understands that they died because of his faith in Christ. But, amazingly, he says that he has forgiven the men responsible for the killings. "Loving and forgiving your enemies is good," he says, "I know my wife and son are with Jesus Christ. Everything that has happened has happened by the grace of God. And I am closer to Jesus than before." He adds this: "There are other people who have been through worse treatment than me. These things happen and this is how we live."

Sometimes when I read stories like this I find it hard to believe that we American Christians live on the same planet with these brave souls. Since we don't have to give up much of anything else to be a Christian in this country, perhaps we can give up a few minutes of our time to pray for our persecuted brothers and sisters around the world. It is the least we can
