# In the freedom we experience, remember persecuted Christians

On one of our trips to India, an Indian Christian asked one of my colleagues an interesting question.

He explained that being a Christian in India was very difficult, that persecution was common and that he had given up much because he was a Christian. Then he asked the question, "What do American Christians have to give up?" It was a difficult question to answer because the honest answer is: nothing.

We are blessed to live in a country which truly believes in freedom of religion. We take this for granted, and sometimes we forget that for most of human history, and in many parts of the world today, this is not the case. Somalia is one of those places.

According to an organization that monitors the persecution of Christians, Somalia is second only to North Korea as the worst persecutor of Christians. Voice of the Martyrs reports, "For more than two decades Somalia has suffered from civil war. Unsuccessful treaties and resolutions among various warring factions have rendered the nation a 'failed state' in the eyes of the international community ... and Christians are targeted by all of the factions fighting for control."

The group that poses the greatest danger is Al-Shabab. Al-Shabab means "the youth" in Arabic. In 2012 it announced that it had joined Al-Qaeda, and it has sworn to rid Somalia of Christians. It has made every effort to keep its

word.

Voice of the Martyrs reports that when Christians are discovered by Al-Shabab, they are sometimes beheaded on the spot. Al-Shabab members have even crossed the border and killed fleeing Christians in the refugee camps of Ethiopia.

One morning in 2007, Diya, a Somali Christian, and his youngest son were sitting in front of their house reading the Bible when a group of men from what is known as the Islamist Courts Union passed by. Diya and his son went into the house, but they had noticed that Diya was reading the Bible.

They knocked on the door. Diya answered. As he did so, one of the men hit him on the head with the butt of his rifle, knocking him unconscious. His son started crying. Diya's wife ran into the main room to see what was going on arriving in time to see one of the men shoot her son in the head, killing him instantly. The bullet that killed him hit her in the stomach. She died a short time later at the hospital.

## Catholic social services agency has new name

Catholic Charities of Salina has changed its name to better reflect the widespread geographic territory it serves.

Effective June 1, the agency will use the name Catholic Charities of Northern Kansas.

"For years we've grappled with the idea," said Dr. Karen Hauser, chief executive officer of the social services agency of the Catholic Diocese of Salina.

While the name coincides with the diocese's name, she said, it doesn't reflect either's territory.

"Our presence is also elsewhere, not just Salina," Hauser said.

The agency and the diocese serve a 31-county area that stretches from the Colorado line on the west to Manhattan and Hanover

on the east.

She, her board and her staff determined after debating the issue that "northern Kansas" best reflected the region served.

Other Catholic Charities agencies have taken a similar approach.

The Salina-based agency has branch offices in Manhattan, Concordia and Hays. Catholic Charities provides adoption and birth parent services, emergency assistance, counseling, legal im-

migration assistance, Hispanic services and family strengthening programs.

The name change will be gradual, Hauser said. Stationery, brochures and other information won't be changed until new supplies are printed.

"We're very frugal. We have to be," Hauser said. "We need to help that young mother who can't

pay her rent or keep the utilities on and is worried about her new baby. We've always put people in need first."
