

# Motorcycle races come to Colby Saturday

Start times have changed for the Kansas Fair Flat Track Series "Battle of the Plains" motorcycle racing event in Colby on Saturday at the Thomas County Fairgrounds.

"When you start, it's kind of a moving target," said Paul Covert of Crooked Creek Promotions, explaining the time changes.

Gates will open at 2 p.m., he said, practice laps will begin at 3, races will start at 5 and the main event will begin at 7 p.m.

Admission for everyone 11 and older is \$10, children 6 to 10 are \$5 and children 5 and under are free.

Flat-track, a type of dirt-bike racing, has a long history in northwest Kansas, Covert said.

# Royals whip White Sox 5-2

CHICAGO - The Kansas City Royals wanted Bruce Chen to show more aggression. He finally did.

Chen outpitched Jake Peavy for his first win in six weeks, Billy Butler hit his career-high 22nd homer and the Royals beat the Chicago White Sox 5-2 on Tuesday night.

The White Sox had won 10 of 13, but saw their lead over Detroit in the AL Central shrink to a half game when the Tigers beat the New York Yankees 6-5 earlier in the night.

Gordon Beckham hit his first career leadoff homer for Chicago, and the White Sox scored again in the sixth after Kansas City tied it in the top half.

But RBI singles by Tony Abreu and Alex Gordon off Peavy (9-8) in the seventh gave Kansas City a 3-2 lead.

Butler added to it in the eighth with a tworun drive off Nate Jones after Mike Moustakas

giving Chen (8-9) his first win since June 26. The left-hander gave up two runs and seven hits in 6 2-3 innings and finally came out on top after going 0-3 in his previous seven starts.

It was a big improvement over his previous outing, when he got knocked out in the third against Cleveland after being staked to a sixrun lead.

He and manager Ned Yost had a long talk about being aggressive following that game, which the Royals eventually won. The message? Go after the hitters, establish the fastball.

It was different against the White Sox.

Even when Beckham connected an 87 mph pitch in the first, Yost didn't blink because the home run came on a fastball. Chen was following the plan.

The way Peavy was pitching, the Royals walked, and the Royals hung on from there, needed that. And the bullpen did its job with dropping 19 of 26 in July.

Kelvin Herrera pitching 1 1-3 innings and Greg Holland retiring the side in the ninth for his second save in four chances.

Peavy also gave up seven hits in 6 2-3 innings, but was a tough-luck loser after beating Minnesota in his previous two starts. He found his control after walking the game's first two batters, issuing just one the rest of the way, but he couldn't protect the lead after the White Sox went up 2-1.


The Royals had runners on first and third with one out in the seventh after Jeff Francoeur reached on a bunt down the third-base line and Eric Hosmer singled. Abreu then tied it with a single to left, and although Hosmer got thrown out at third by Dayan Viciedo, the Royals weren't finished.

Jarrod Dyson just beat out a single to second after Beckham made a diving stop on his grounder, and Gordon then chased Peavy with a single to center that made it 3-2, putting Kansas City up for good.
