I often am asked how to know if a prize you're offered is a scam. Scammers will follow the exciting news that you ve won with a money to cover taxes, fees, shipping or other costs - even though it's illegal in most places, including Kansas, to require purchases or the payment of fees and taxes upfront before you can receive a prize. Also, remember, the Kansas Lottery is the only legally oper-
ating lottery in Kansas. Anyone claiming you have won a foreign
