Every morning I receive an e-mail devotion from the Henri Nouwen Society. Even though Nouwen died in 1996, he remains alive to his followers through his writings.

Nouwen was ordained a priest in Holland in 1956, but came to the United States to study psychology and to teach at Notre Dame and the Divinity schools at Yale and Harvard. He left the world of academics to live

in a Trappist monastery, and later with the poor in Peru. He then became involved with L'Arche communities in France and in Canada. L'Arche commu-

nities are home to people with severe disabilities who, with the help of assistants, live as independent a life as possible.

meditations was on the theme of poverty. He was not speaking about financial poverty, but the poverty that affects each of us personally. He calls each person to ask him- or herself "What is my poverty?" Is it the lack of money, the lack of emotional stability, lack of a loving partner, lack of security, lack of safety, lack of self-confidence? Perhaps it is the absence of hope or faith. Nouwen contends that poverty has many forms and we all have our place of poverty.

But it is in recognizing and admitting our poverty that we become rich, because it is our place of poverty that God wants to dwell.

In Matthew 5:3 Jesus says, "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." When we can recognize and accept our poverty we are open to for, the presence of God and the fullness of God's blessings.

Matthew was not speaking about the kingdom of heaven as a post-death experience, but as the new, transformed life we have in Jesus Christ.

I was made weak, that I might learn humbly to obey.... I asked for health, that I might

do greater things, I was given infirmity, that I

might do better things....

I asked for riches, that I might be happy,

I was given poverty, that I might be wise

I asked for power, that I might have the praise of men, I was given weakness, that I

might feel the need of God.... I asked for all things, that I

might enjoy life,

I was given life, that I might enjoy all things....

I got nothing that I asked for but everything that I had hoped

Almost despite myself, my unspoken prayers were answered.

I am among all men most richly blessed.




