Despite his prediction that Obama will retain the presidency, Hansen said he thinks that the Republicans will take over the Senate. This will leave Obama without a clear message from voters to advance his policies, but it will also give Republicans a share of the responsibility if anything goes wrong.

If Romney wins, he said, Democrats might try to block any progress that he tries to make, in the same way that many feel Republicans have done to Obama.

Not everyone in the audience agreed with Hansen.

Ethan Schwarz, Oakley, a freshman at the college, made the opposite prediction after

"I think Romney will be president," Schwarz said. "There is polarization, but I believe that it has turned more Democrats into moderate Republicans."
