Farmers brace for crop

He said the other crop being harvested right now is soybeans, and some decent yields have come in for the irrigated crop.

"A lot of them were droughtstressed, some of those were failures, too," Milliman said, but he added that, "for the most part, they've had some decent yields, at least for the irrigated."

Soybeans are predicted at 70.4 million bushels, down 31 percent from 2011 and the lowest crop since 2003. The per-acre yield is predicted to be 21 bushels, the lowest since 2000 and six bushels less than last year.

Irrigated soybeans have been averaging 50 bushels per acre, as opposed to the typical yield of 80 to 90 bushels, Milliman said. He does not have numbers for dryland beans vet.

Other crops do not look much better. The sorghum harvest is predicted to be 88 million bushels this year, down 20 percent from last year and the lowest crop since 1956. The per acre sorghum yield, 40 bushels, is down 15 bushels from last year and the lowest per acre yield since 1974.

Milliman said that the county's drought-stressed sorghum has been slow to mature and should be harvested, along with sunflowers, during late October and November. The expectations are not any higher for ties. those crops.
