The men finished seventh as a team, competing against 22 colleges and universities. Jonathan Burgess, Brisbane, Australia, and led the Trojans, finishing third and sixth, respectively.

'We competed against nationally-ranked Iowa Central (second), and Allen County Community College (third)," said Coach James Ortiz. "This race was a good measure of where we stand."

Colby was ranked fourth in the National Junior College Athletic Association's national rankings last week, but updated rankings released Wednesday put the Trojans in eighth.
