

Oakley recognized for supporting annual state hunt

The Kansas Department of Wildlife, Parks and Tourism Division of Tourism, recognized the City of Oakley with this year's Tourism Partnership Award on Oct. 16, during the 2012 Kansas Tourism Conference in Dodge City. The 2012 Governor's Tourism Award was also presented at the conference, which was co-sponsored by the Travel Industry Association of Kansas.

Raelene Keller and Jim and Lori Millensifer accepted the award on behalf of the Oakley, whose people were enthusiastic and cooperative hosts for the Inaugural Governor's Ringneck Classic pheasant hunt last November. Their efforts focused attention on the hunting opportunities in Kansas. Oakley is holding the event again this year.

The award was developed to recognize the importance of collaboration in the development of tourism in Kansas. Efforts would not be successful without the work of many organizations and businesses that step up and work with the Division of Tourism.

The Flint Hills Nature Trail received the 2012 Governor's Tourism Award. In the past 10 years, over \$800,000 in private funding was raised to support over 60 miles of trail that has been constructed and opened. Hard-work-

ing volunteers continue to build and maintain the trail.

On the right-of-way of the famous "Colorado Eagle Line" of the Missouri Pacific Railroad, the 154-mile long Flint Hills Nature Trail is the longest trail in Kansas and seventh longest rail-trail in America. It spans seven counties and covers more than 2,000 acres from Herington to Osawatimie, crossing a wide variety of natural areas including the Chippewa Hills, the riparian forests of the Marais des Cygnes and Neosho River valley, and the Flint Hills, which are the largest expanse of tallgrass prairie remaining in the world. The trail links state and local parks, wildlife areas, waterfalls and wetlands, and shares Kansas' heritage with those that trek it.

The governor's award was established in 1983 to recognize Kansans for outstanding contributions to the travel and tourism industry and to encourage others in the industry to strive for excellence.

Tourism is the third largest industry in Kansas, with a total economic impact of about \$5.46 billion. Half of tourism expenditures in Kansas come from out-of-state visitors.

Town catches pet cats when going after strays

NORTH CHARLEROI, Pa. (AP) — A tiny western Pennsylvania borough's plan to trap stray cats has angered residents who say their pets have been swept up in the trapping effort, which the pet owners say wasn't well-publicized.

KDKA-TV (cbsloc.al/V46XuF) reports angry pet owners pelted North Charleroi council members with questions at Monday night's council meeting. Adding to the drama was the absence of a newly-hired animal control officer

who has been trapping the cats, but didn't show up at the meeting as requested.

The borough's attorney says residents have 48 hours to claim their pets if they're trapped. But residents say they wouldn't have known that because the trapping plans weren't well-publicized. But council members say they announced the plan at their August meeting.

Council is now considering giving residents up to 10 days to claim their cats.
