

One issue highlighted by several

presenters is that the job creators of the future will seek regulatory flexibility for buying renewable energy. They spoke to the need to ensure that transmission needs and permitting issues are addressed so that more renewable energy proj-

ects can get online in Kansas.

The energy efficiency initiatives of MARS, in particular, were described by Rabinovitch, who outlined the significant waste reductions and improved efficiency across his company's supply

dustry needs more cooperation between government and utilities to get renewable efforts off the ground in Kansas. Graham of BP Wind Energy

echoed this sentiment: "The wind industry is constrained by a lack of transmission and needs assurance that it can get on to the existing grid in accordance with fair and nondiscriminatory government policies.

"The strongest wind resources are often in out-of-the way places and far from the metropolitan areas where the energy would be consumed. This is an opportunity for states like Kansas who have great wind to access nearby markets with new transmission
