bid over one spade is ambiguous. It might range from a poor six-point hand without spade or club support to a moderate hand with as many as 10

By rebidding your spades, you indicate five cards in the suit. Partner can then infer that you
must also have at least five clubs, since you would not have bid clubs first with less than a five-card suit.
