The Colby High varsity wrestling squad took first place Saturday at the St. Francis Invitational.

Coach Matt Sims said Colby was led by five individual champions: Dustin Reed, 126 pounds; Macen Shull, 138; Quade Woofter, 170; Beau Brown, 182; and Zell Bieberle, 285.

All five wrestlers are undefeated and 0 losses along with 3 pins. Shull is also 3-0 with 1 pin and 2 wins by major decision. Woofter is 3-0 with 1 win by forfeit and 2 pins; Brown 2-0 with 1 pin; and Bieberle 2-0, both pins.

Taylor O'Leary, 120, finished in second place while David Mainus, 113, Kyle Finley 145, and Troy Ouenzer, 195, each came in third.

O'Leary is 2-1 overall, getting 1 pin and 1 technical fall. Mainus 3 pins and 1 forfeit; and Quenzer Austin Schissler 4-0 with 2 pins; Colby Free Press on Thursday.
