Klein, K-State's Heisman Trophy finalist, brought the Wildcats back, scoring on a 6-yard touchdown run by scrambling and diving for the pylon early in the sec-

He led Kansas State (11-2) on another scoring drive that resulted in Anthony Cantele's 25-yard field goal to cut Oregon's lead to 15-
