# Colby varsity girls win tight game at home

The Colby High varsity girls basketball team won a close game Friday, overcoming the Holcomb Lady Longhorns 51-46 at the Community Building.

The Lady Eagles (10-5 overall, 5-2 Great West Activities Conference) started off slow with only 10 points in the first quarter while Holcomb put in 12.

Due to an error, the stats for the second and third quarters were not available. The Colby girls scored 27 points between the two quarters and Holcomb could only get 16 points to fall.

The girls played a close fourth quarter and Holcomb outscored Colby 18-14, but the Lady Eagles held on for the win, 51-46. Senior Kenzie Curry had a game-high 16 points, including 4 three-point shots. She was 4 of 8 on field goals and grabbed 3 rebounds and an assist.

The Colby boys struggled after the break, putting in only 6 points while Holcomb piled on 25. The Longhorns sealed the game in the fourth, outscoring Colby 18-10 to get the win, 76-44.

Senior Todd Kane scored a game-high 21 points, including 4 three-point shots. He sank 6 of 11 from the field and added 2 rebounds and an assist. Senior Wiatt Binder put in 9 points and grabbed 2 rebounds; junior Marc Bremenkamp finished with 6 points and 3 rebounds; senior Zane Winger chipped in 3 points, 3 rebounds and an assist; junior Luke Cox had 2 points and 4 assists; and sophomore Ashton Russ made a free throw and had an assist.
