of April as "Safe Digging Month" in Kansas. The proclamation, in concurrence with National Safe Digging Month, reminds Kansans to call 811 before starting any outdoor digging projects.

"We join Gov. Brownback in strongly encouraging individuals and companies to call 811 before they begin digging," said Kansas Corporation Commission Chairman Mark Sievers. "Locating underground lines is a shared responsibility, critical to your safety and to the integrity of our underground utility system. Enjoy the upcoming weather, but know what's below.'

All right, go ahead. Guess what garden crop has emerged from obscurity to popularity in just the last two or three decades.

In the mid-60s and even the 70s, it was to be found only in Italian gardens and most Americans didn't even know how to spell it. Like pizza, which also came from Italy about the same time, many people have learned to thoroughly enjoy it in this country. But unlike pizza, this garden vegetable is a veritable powerhouse of nutritional value. A party tray of fresh raw vegetables just isn't the same without it, and many school lunch programs now offer it on their

ies like Packman or Green Comet. Harvest time for broccoli comes when the florets of the head are tightly packed and are a dark gray-green color. But if you wait too long, those florets become beautiful little yellow flowers, and you've lost the crop.

When you bring the heads to the kitchen from the garden, drop them in a pan of salt water or vinegar water. If there are little green cabbage worms inside the head, they will be dislodged by the water solution.
