Colby softball girls win two in Goodland

Colby High School senior Kenzie Curry picked up the win during a 13-0 game in Goodland, one of two wins for the Lady Eagles varsity softball squad in Monday's doubleheader against the rival

Stephani DeLaRosa started on the mound for the Cowgirls. In the top of the first, Curry got a base hit, stole second and got over to third on a wild pitch. 
