

# **Baseball team** splits games against Seward

The Colby Community College Carter, split four games over the weekend with the Seward County Community College Saints.

The Trojans played two games each on Saturday and Sunday in Liberal. In game one on Saturday, Daniel Mackay pitched, allowing just two runs, but the Trojans couldn't get the offense going and lost 2-0.

Mackay baffled Seward, striking out six batters, and allowed one earned run, five hits and no walks over six innings. The lead stayed with him after the first inning, when Liberal scored one run on an RBI single.

Game two on Saturday was a 12-5 blowout for the Trojans. Hunter Brown racked up four RBIs on three hits for Colby. He singled in the first inning, homered in the third and doubled in an 11-1 win over the Saints. the fourth.
