Visitors Center celebrates Tourism Week

May went quickly and we thoroughly enjoyed our Tourism Week activities. The Volunteer Appreciation Luncheon was May 8. Thirty-two Colby Visitors Center volunteers and community leaders were in attendance. We are pleased to let you know that 21 volunteers worked last year greeting over 1,000 registered visitors.

The theme of this year's week was Power of Travel. For instance, according to a study commissioned by Kansas Wild Life, Parks and Tourism, each visitor generates about \$250 in expenditures. Every 217 visitors create a new job in Kansas and each visitor adds about \$182 to the gross state product.

The same firm, his Global Insight, also broke down tourism expenditures by county in 2011. They reported that Thomas County received \$77.93 million from tourists. The entire northwest region was \$419.4 million. Thomas County was second highest, with only Ellis County at \$143.25 million being higher. The report says that in Thomas County \$1.44 million was spent on entertainment, \$15.89 million on accommodations, \$16.50 million on transpor-



tation, \$21.43 million on food and \$22.68 million shopping. Yes that is the power of travel.
