coming year in its general fund. Expenditures come to \$178,000 in adult education, \$4,000 in adult supplemental education and \$2,065,000 in auxiliary enterprise.

In other business, the trustees: Discussed former college attorney John Gatz, who recently withdrew his proposal to stay on as the attorney. President Dr. Stephen Vacik said Gatz's contract ran out June 30. He talked

with the Kansas Association of School Boards, asking where the college could get another attorney.

He said the college was not dissatisfied with Gatz's performance, but that he asked for a 10 percent raise, and the college could not give one when salaries for the rest of the staff has stayed the same. Waites added it would not be responsible to do so when the college's finances were in such bad shape.

Vacik said he could ask the

association for help, but that they deal with school districts, not colleges. He and the trustees discussed hiring a local attorney, looking for one from a larger city like Hays or Garden City, or a talking to other community colleges to find one.

The trustees agreed to try to hire Gatz for special projects, to get advice for issues such as changes to the drug policy for the veterinary technician program.

But young Larry didn't want a career in music until much later. He said he hid his musical talents when he was young because of peer pressure.

Instead, he put his efforts into sports, earning a baseball scholarship to Nashville's Belmont College where he played for three years.

"Sports took me to Nashville," said Stewart, and while he was in Nashville, his musical talent blossomed. He started singing jingles while he was in college and playing at other musicians' studio sessions.

In 1983, several musicians formed the band Restless Heart, and they asked Stewart to be their lead vocalist. He turned them down.

"The last thing I wanted to do was go

back home and tell my fiance's dad I was going to join a country band," he said.

But the band was persistent, and, just after Thanksgiving 1983, they called him again. "Something took my mouth and tongue and said yes," he joked. "God intervened."

The next spring, Stewart married, went on his honeymoon and recorded his first album all in the same month.

At their first show, Restless Heart opened for the group Alabama, and Stewart said he was scared to death.

A lot of country music critics did not like the group's unique vocal sound, predicting they would split within two years, said Stewart.

"Country music was very traditional then," Stewart said, but while the critics had their doubts, the fans did not. Over the next several years, their singles hit the tops of the

country music charts again and again, including seven number one singles in a row.

Thirty years later, the original band members are still together and still entertaining their fans.

"We appreciate the opportunity to play for folks," Stewart said. He describes their show as energetic, saying some fans have told him the group sounds even better in person than on their albums.

The group recently released "The Playlist," a collection of their best music plus some new recordings. Their first-ever Christmas album, a combination of classic Christmas songs and originals, is scheduled for release on October 31.

Restless Heart performs at 8 p.m. Friday in the grandstands at the Thomas County Fairgrounds. Tickets are \$20 and can be purchased at the fairgrounds ticket office.
