# Colby reaches state final, but falls to Victoria

A 25-6 finale should never erase what Colby K-18 accomplished during its 29-win journey to the state championship game.

"I'm so proud of this team," coach Brian Quagliano said. "We almost accomplished both of our goals (reach state final, win it). We gave ourselves a chance to get both of them."

Colby's Tanner Elias recently earned honors from the Boone and Crockett Club, the nation's most prestigious conservation and big game hunting organization.


