Pole-barn building company opens up new office in Colby

Cleary Building Corp., a nationwide builder of pole-barn style buildings, has opened an office in Colby.

Previously, the nearest company office to Colby was in Hays, but this new office will handle a territory covering northwest Kansas and eastern Colorado.

"People need structures Cleary builds," said Jonas Berberich, who works in the company's corporate office in Verona, Wis.

The company builds "customized pre-engineered structures, commonly called pole barns," said Berberich.

Leitner said he can sit down with a customer at his office or the customer's home and design a customized building using a computer program that gives the customer an exact picture of what the building will look like.
