The junior varsity girls followed the varsity lead in their win over Tribune, but had to go three sets. They defeated the Lady Jackrabbits 25-18 in the first set, but took a close 25-23 in the second.

Both teams kept up the pace in the third with the Lady Bulldogs coming out with a 15-12 victory.

"We were nervous throughout the game because it was so close," Bulldog player Gabrielle Schiltz said.

"But we kept ourselves composed to get the win," teammate Morgan Ritter added.

The JV girls will play at home again on Tuesday when they challenge Quinter, Cheylin and Heartland.
