State livestock show competitors include two kids from here

Cassie Wells of Colby and Makayla Hoffman, formerly of Colby, will be among the exhibitors at the 81st Annual Kansas Junior Livestock Show which begins today. Wells will be competing in meat goat and goat showmanship categories, while Hoffman has entered in Angus breeding heifer, Simmental breeding heifer and beef showmanship categories.

It promises to be a big event this year, with 795 youth from 92 counties entering 1,817 animals. This is the largest number of livestock entered in 25 years. The statewide event will be held today through Monday at the Kansas Pavilions in Wichita.

The grand and reserve steers, hogs, lambs and goats will be sold during the KJLS Auction of Champions at 7 p.m. Monday. The public is welcome and encouraged to support the event by bidding on livestock. Participants typically use the money earned from selling these animals to help fund their college educations and purchase next year's livestock projects.

Before the auction the show will present a number of scholarships ranging from \$750 to \$2,500 to exhibitors who have excelled academically, in community service and in 4-H and FFA. Last year, a total of \$23,000 was awarded to 13 exhibitors.

Separate from the selection of species champions, a showmanship contest will be held. The top showman in both the junior and senior divisions of each species will receive a silver belt buckle. Prizes also will be awarded for second through fifth place in each division.

The Kansas Livestock Foundation will sponsor a club calf show and sale Saturday. Sale proceeds will go toward Youth in Agriculture scholarships.

The Mid-America Classic Collegiate Livestock Judging Contest also will be held in conjunction with the show. More than 300 students representing 20 junior and senior colleges nationwide will be participating Saturday.

Do NOT give your personal information out to unknown callers or door-to-door salespersons.

DETECT

Review your Medicare Summary Notice (MSN) and Part D Explanation of Benefits (EOB) for mistakes.

Look for three things:

1. Charges for something you didn't get.
2. Billing for the same thing twice.
3. Services that were not ordered by your doctor.

REPORT

If you suspect errors, fraud or abuse, report it IMMEDIATELY!
