ORDINANCE INCORPORATING THE STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE BY REFERENCE

ORDINANCE NO. 317

An ordinance regulating traffic within the corporate limits of the City of Brewster, Kansas; incorporating by reference the "Standard Traffic Ordinance for Kansas Cities," edition of 2013; with certain omissions, changes and additions; prescribing additional regulations; providing certain penalties and repealing ordinance numbered 310.

Be it Ordained by the Governing Body of the City of Brewster, Kansas:

INCORPORATING Section 1. STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE. There is hereby incorporated by reference for the purpose of regulating traffic within the corporate limits of the City of Brewster, Kansas, that certain standard traffic ordinance known as the "Standard Traffic Ordinance for Kansas Cities," Edition of 2013, prepared and published in book form by the League of Kansas Municipalities, Topeka, Kansas, save and except such articles, sections, parts or portions as are hereafter omitted, deleted, modified or changed. One copy of said "Standard Traffic Ordinance" shall be marked or stamped "Official Copy as Adopted by Ordinance No. 317," with all sections or portions thereof intended to be omitted or changed clearly marked to show any such omission or change and to which shall be attached a copy of this ordinance, and filed with the city clerk to be open to inspection and available to the public at all reasonable hours. The police department, municipal udge and all administrative departments of the city charged with enforcement of the ordinance shall be supplied, at the cost of the city, such number of official copies of such "Standard Traffic Ordinance" similarly marked, as may be deemed expedient.

Section 2. OMITTING PROVISIONS.

Sections 114.1, 114.2, 114.4 and 114.5 of said" Standard Traffic Ordinance" relating to the unlawful operation of All-Terrain Vehicles, Micro Utility Trucks, Golf Carts and Work-Site Utility Vehicles is hereby declared to be and is omitted and deleted.

Section 3. CHANGING PROVISIONS. Section 33 (a) of said Standard Traffic ordinance is hereby changed to read as follows: Except as provided in subsection (b) and except when a special hazard exists that requires lower speed for compliance with K.S.A. 8-1557, and amendments thereto, the limits specified in this subsection or established as authorized by law shall be maximum lawful speeds,

and no person shall operate a vehicle at a speed in excess of such maximum limits:

Section 33. Maximum Speed Limits.

- In any business district, 20 miles (1) per hour;
- (2) In any urban district, 20 miles per hour;
- (3) On any county or township highway, 40 miles per hour; and
- (4) On all other highways, 40 miles per hour.

Section 4. TRAFFIC INFRACTIONS AND TRAFFIC OFFENSES.

An ordinance traffic infraction is a (a) violation of any section of this ordinance that prescribes or requires the same behavior as that prescribed or required by a statutory provision that is classified as a traffic infraction in K.S.A. 8-2118. (b) All traffic violations which are included within this ordinance, and which are not ordinance traffic infractions, as defined in subsection (a) of this section, shall be considered traffic offenses

Section 5. PENALTY FOR SCHEDULED

FINES. The fine for violation of an ordinance traffic infraction or any other traffic offense for which the municipal judge establishes a fine in a fine schedule shall not be less than \$10.00 nor more than \$500.00, except for speeding which shall not be less than \$10.00 nor more than \$200.00. A person tried and convicted for violation of an ordinance traffic infraction or other traffic offense for which a fine has been established in a schedule of fines shall pay a fine fixed by the court not to exceed \$500.00.

Section 6. REPEAL. Ordinance No. 310 is repealed.

Section 7. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the official city newspaper.
