

Q: Please tell me the value of a Martha Washington sewing cabinet that belonged to my great-grandmother in the 1880s. It has four long legs and three drawers in the front. There is a semicircular storage compartment with a hinged lid on each side. And why is it named after George Washington's wife?

A: Martha Washington (1731-1802) enjoyed knitting and used a similar type of sewing table, without drawers, at Mount Vernon. The style you describe, along with its name, was not introduced until the 1920s. The First Lady's name was used to market the style, which became especially popular during the Depression.


In other words, your great-grandmother's table is not as old as you think it is. But depending on its quality and condition, it could sell for about \$200.

Q: When cleaning out a cupboard, I found an Old Plantation wooden cigar box about 7 1/2 inches long and 5 1/2 inches wide. The outside and inside labels picture plantation scenes. There's a 1901 IRS stamp on it. Please tell me something about the box.

A: The value of old wooden cigar boxes varies considerably depending on condition. The Old Plantation brand name dates from around the turn of the 20th century. Some Old Plantation boxes have impressed labels, while others have paper labels. A box with inside and outside paper labels in excellent condition recently auctioned for nearly \$500.



Famous Hand

This deal occurred in an invitational pair tournament in the Netherlands in 1990. The winners were Enri Leufkens and Berry Westra of the 20 Netherlands, who outdistanced a strong multinational field comprising 16 pairs of the world's 23 best players.

When Westra-Leufkens held the North-South 24 cards, the bidding went as shown. A panel of ex-25 pert commentators, watching on Vu-Graph, pre-28 dicted that four hearts would go down one after West led the nine of clubs, since declarer seemed 29 certain to lose a club, a spade and two diamonds.

But Leufkens demonstrated that they were sorely mistaken. He took East's jack of clubs with the ace and immediately returned the club ten. East won with the king and shifted to the A-J of diamonds, allowing the defenders to score their two diamond tricks before South could discard a diamond on the queen of clubs. In the process, however, dummy's 10-9 of diamonds became established.

After taking the diamond king, West shifted to a spade, East's queen losing to the ace. Leufkens now avoided the trap of playing the A-K of trumps and then trying to get rid of his two remaining spades on two of dummy's winners.

Instead, he crossed to the heart ace, cashed the club queen, pitching a spade, and led the diamond ten. East was helpless. If he discarded, Leufkens would discard his last spade, so East ruffed and declarer overruffed. Leufkens then returned to dummy with the heart king -- simultaneously drawing the last two opposing trumps -- and disposed of his last spade on the diamond nine.

Thus, the "unmakable" contract came home, leaving the red-faced panel to partake of a generous portion of humble pie.
