



### **KIWI BERRIES**

Dear Readers: A new fruit is in town: kiwi berries, a cousin to the kiwi. They are like the kiwi fruit, but different. The inside of the fruit is a green color and has a texture similar to traditional kiwi. These little jewels have a smooth outer skin, do not need to be peeled and can be popped into your mouth like grapes!

They grow on a vine that takes six years to mature and provide a marketable harvest. There are farms in Oregon and Pennsylvania growing it.

Found in specialty grocery stores, the berries should be kept refrigerated and dry, but let warm to room temperature before eating. If you see these berries, grab them fast, because they are available only for a couple of months, September and October! - Heloise



# **Delicate Defensive Play**

Good defense often requires perfect teamwork, as in this deal where South was in four spades.

West led the queen of hearts, East playing the seven and South the three. It is true that in most leagues a seven is regarded as a come-on signal, and many West players would therefore lead an-

This would have been fatal in the present case because, after ruffing the heart and drawing trumps, declarer would force out the ace of clubs and score 10 tricks. But West shifted to the jack of diamonds at trick

two, recognizing that East had played his lowest heart (the 6-5-4-3-2 were all in plain sight) and that East would have played a heart higher than the seven had he wanted the suit continued. Declarer finessed the diamond queen, losing to

the king, and East, aware that another heart lead might be ruffed, returned the nine of diamonds. South won with the ace, drew trumps and led a club. West took the ace and now had to decide whether to try to cash a diamond or a heart. Had he led a heart, hoping declarer had another

card in the suit -- West could not know whether East had five or six hearts -- South would have gotten home safely. But West played the ten of diamonds and so de-

feated the contract. This was not simply a lucky shot; the solution lay in East's earlier nine-ofdiamonds return. By convention, had East started with four

diamonds, he would have returned his fourthbest diamond after taking the king to show his length in that suit. When he returned the nine, he indicated that he had fewer than four diamonds which in turn told West that declarer had another diamond to lose.


