It sparked renewed interest in needlework items that had been popular in previous generations, such as cross-stitch samplers, hooked rugs and quilts.

Textiles traditionally have been closely connected to women's lives and quilting, in particular, allowed women to believe Sundays and holidays. they were participating in a needle art practiced by their colonial grandmothers. By mak-
