



Heloise Hints from Heloise Blue parmesan makes him sad

Dear Heloise: One cannot purchase small amounts of freshly ground parmesan cheese in most supermarkets. We don't use much, and by the time we've gotten halfway through, we see blue spots in the Parmesan, which we discard. Any suggestions? — John Campbell, via email

Yes, and it's very simple: Buy a small block of cheese and grate it yourself. The shelf life for fresh-ground Parmesan is about two weeks (after opening). Be prepared to use it within this time. Once grated, store it in an airtight glass or plastic container in the refrigerator.

When buying a wedge/whole piece of Parme san, wrap the cheese in wax or brown paper, followed by plastic wrap around the outside. The cheese will be able to breathe, but will remain airtight. – Heloise

BEAN DIP

Dear Heloise: I could have cried when I realized I'd thrown away my copy of your recipe for refried bean dip. Please reprint it for me. - Cora J. in Texas

Cora, don't cry! Hard to believe this recipe was first printed in 1971 by my mother (the original Heloise, 1919-1977), but it is just as good today Gather these ingredients:

2 cups of pinto beans, cooked or canned (drained and rinsed)

2 slices of very crisp bacon

- A pinch of garlic
- A pinch of chili powder

Place all the ingredients in a blender. Blend until the mixture is smooth, or leave slightly chunky. Refrigerate until cool.


I add a couple of drops of hot sauce at times, but you can add chopped jalapeños, green olives or any other extra to make it your own. All recipes can be changed to fit one's personal taste. Think Before You Act

One of the gratifying aspects of bridge is that careless or thoughtless play does not often go unpunished. Perpetrators usually pay for their indiscretions.

Consider this case where South reached three 28 notrump on the bidding shown. East won the diamond lead with the king, cashed the ace and returned a diamond, West discarding a club.

Declarer now cashed his four club winners, hoping to induce a spade discard from one or 35 both opponents. But both defenders hung on to their spades, discarding hearts when they ran out 36 of clubs.

When declarer next played the A-K of spades, East's jack fell, but South was in no position to enjoy this windfall. If he cashed dummy's ten, he could not get to his hand to collect the queen, while if he overtook the ten with the queen, West's nine would become the high spade.

South's downfall can be attributed directly to his misguided attempt to induce a defensive error by cashing his clubs immediately. In so doing, he gave up a perfectly legitimate chance to score four spade tricks if either opponent started with the singleton or doubleton jack of spades about an 18 percent possibility. This, combined with the 36 percent chance of a 3-3 spade division, would have given him better than a 50 percent chance of making the contract.

Had South simply cashed the A-K of spades while he still had the ace of clubs in his hand, he would have had no difficulty collecting the nine tricks he started with.
