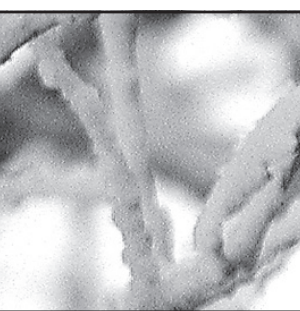

# All Tied Up in Knotts coming to Oakley Sunday

Karen Knotts, of the famous Don Knotts family, will appear at the Oakley High School Auditorium at 3 p.m. Sunday, sponsored by the Western Plains Arts Association.

Her one woman show, "All Tied Up in Knotts," is a story about her life growing up as the daughter of actor Don Knotts.

beans and tomatoes. At one point, she said, the Abilene Huskies 4-H Club helped out.

Sue Evans, who works with the coalition, said the produce was split among 316 people this year at various places in Colby. Much of it was given out at the Genesis/Thomas County food bank, to garden volunteers. It was also shared at Kids Port childcare center, the Colby Community College block party, and a summer youth program at the Colby Methodist Church,

or used in Kids a Cookin' classes organized by the Thomas County Extension.

Both the number of volunteers, 23, and the amount of produce they raised was an increase from last year, Evans said. That was when the garden first moved from K-State Research and Extension. It now sits on a 3,000 square foot plot owned by Linda and Tuffy Taylor just west of the Southwind Mall parking lot.

2012 had a bad growing season, Evans said, with lots of blowing wind and almost no tomatoes. The volunteers are

considering plots for individual families to work on next year.

Evans said the garden got a \$3,200 grant this year from the Kansas Health Foundation, administered by the K-State Research and Extension. The grant went to build a shed, among other things. Evans thanked the Taylors, and Duane Cheney for helping build the garden beds and giving advice on what to grow.

With people headed to work and school the next morning, Alexander said, police sent out a statement to say they were looking for Gill and giving his description. It went out just after 7 a.m. on a cold, wet Monday morning. At 10:30 a.m., Gill was arrested "just a few miles" from where he started running, according to a second statement.

Both men are being held on charges unrelated

to the burglary until they can be formally charged, Alexander said.

Gill, listed in jail records as white, is currently being held for drug possession with intent to distribute, possession of drug paraphernalia and interference with a law enforcement officer. Hoyte is listed as black; he is being held for drug possession with intent to distribute and possession of drug paraphernalia. Each man is being held on a \$100,000 bond.

# City saves money with new water meters

visits for five years. They will test about 120 meters each time, and pay the difference if they are not reading with 98.5 percent accuracy.

McGreer told the council members that the project has detected 51 leaks so far since last October. This includes some small leaks, and some inside people's homes.

"We've even knocked on doors saying we have a leak in your house," he said.

When asked by Council President Fred Taylor if the water system was more efficient now, McGreer admitted there have been some large water main breaks this year, so it's hard to tell.

"I think it is saving us water," he said.

In other business:

The council approved a general agreement with a Kansas City engineering firm, Sega, which is working on a project with the city to retrofit several engines at the power plant. City Manager Tyson McGreer said

the agreement is meant to include the general terms and conditions for any engineering project the firm does for Colby, and includes terms on insurance and liabilities taken on by each party.

Among other things, McGreer said, the contract gives Colby the right to hire other firms for engineering projects. The city can terminate the contract with Sega at any time with seven days notice.

Future contracts with the firm will now just need to include the specific parameters of each task

that the firm takes on for the city.

The council went into closed session for 20 minutes with McGreer and city attorney John Gatz to discuss the acquisition of real estate. No action was announced from the session.

The council approved a three percent increase in the lease fees on hangars at the airport.

McGreer reported that Police Chief Ron Alexander was coming back that night with a newly-purchased Tahoe to hold a police dog. The dog will be here around February, he said.
