# Eagles, area football players make all-league

With 12 all-league selections, the Colby area featured elite football players at every position except kicker this fall.

The Colby Eagles (three selections), Triplains-Brewster Titans (five) and Golden Plains Bulldogs (four) all earned post-season recognition for their efforts during this 2013 season.

Colby senior Andrew Taylor made quite an impact on both sides of the ball against Great West Athletic Conference foes.

Coaches named Taylor allconference first team at both running back and linebacker. He was Colby's leading tackler (62 solos), rusher (355 yards) and tireless leader throughout a tough 0-9
