Colby High's heaviest wrestlers continued to carry their own weight brilliantly with three championships at the St. Francis Invitational on Saturday.

Senior Andrew Taylor (182 pounds), junior Jay Ziegelmeier (195) and sophomore Austin Hart (220) all scored pins to clinch a season-opening dual win over 6A No. 10 Dodge City.

On Saturday, all three dominated their divisions while leading the Eagles' 114-point performance. Colby's young lineup featuring four freshman finished behind only 4A No. 8 Goodland (164) and Sterling, Colo., (147).

The 3A No. 1-rated Norton Bluejays were a distant seventh overall with just 56 points.

Freshmen Ethan Jay and Tate Carney reached title matches for Colby. They both placed second.

It was Colby's only road trip through these first two weeks. The Eagles now get ready to wrestle a home triangular Thursday (5 p.m.) against Oakley and Pine Creek.


