Delegates to the National 4-H Congress interact with other youths from across the country while participating in workshops, community service and sightseeing in Atlanta.

According to Pam Van Horn, Kansas 4-H Youth Development specialist, many times the youth enjoy community service the most of any activity at the conference. "It's a very handson conference," she said.

"Youth at National 4-H Congress learn about themselves, increase knowledge, build skills, and reach out to others," Van Horn said.
