Air Force Prep's attack was stealth enough to hit 15 threepointers in a 78-76 comeback win over Colby Community College Thursday night.

'We didn't react fast enough and find their shooters," coach Rusty Grafel said about his team's first home loss this season at the Colby Community Building. "Our goal was to get there before the catch (and shoot). Instead, they got too way too many open looks. We let them get too comfortable."

The Trojans (9-6 record) actually shot ahead 17-2 as Jeremiah Ingram scored seven quick points and Kyle Summers smoothly swished Colby's first trifecta.

"It was one of our best starts of the year," Grafel observed.

Strong Trojan defense nearly forced an Air Force shot-clock violation on the next possession only to see Brendan Leonard bury a buzzer-beating three.


The Eagles recovered for a 51-15 nightcap win over Oakley. Holzmeister and Jay both won again to cap 2-0 evenings. All three teams now get ready
