Fallen driver's son wins Pepsi 400

DAYTONABEACH, Fla. (AP) - Dale Earnhardt Jr. raced to a storybook triumph at the scene of his father's death Saturday night, winning the Pepsi 400.

Driving a white car on the same track where Dale Earnhardt's famed black machine hit the wall five months ago, Earnhardt Jr. dominated Daytona the way his father used to, proving he may indeed be ready to step in for NASCAR's fallen hero.

Pushed back to seventh place after a late yellow flag, Earnhardt regained the lead with 4 1/2 laps remaining. A few laps later, teammate and Daytona 500 winner Michael Waltrip overtook Bobby Laborte for the second position, then protected Earnhardt as he closed out the dramatic victory.

Two new all-stars added to game

Cliff Floyd and Mike Cameron were added to the All-Star team due to injuries.

Floyd, the Florida Marlins outfielder who has been sniping with NL manager Bobby Valentine, replaced New York Mets pitcher Rick Reed, who has a sore neck and back.

Cameron replaced Tampa Bay's Greg Vaughn, giving the host Mariners eight players for Tuesday night's game, the most since Pittsburgh placed eight players on the NL team in 1960.

American wins second Wimbledon

WIMBLEDON, England (AP) - Venus Williams won her second consecutive Wimbledon title by beating Belgian Justine Henin 6-1, 3-6, 6-0.

In the men's final on Monday Goran Ivanisevic became one of Wimbledon's most improbable champions by beating Patrick Rafter in five sets after barely getting into the tournament.

Two points away from defeat, Ivanisevic rallied to beat Rafter 6-3, 3-6, 6-3, 2-6, 9-7 and become the second player to win a Wimbledon title without being seeded. Boris Becker did it in 1985.

Thrilling race opens new track

KANSAS CITY, Kan. (AP) — It's hard to beat a man with a secret I've run in a long time."

"I had an advantage, and it wasn't superior driving skills," said Eddie Cheever Jr., the winner of Sunday's Ameristar Casino Indy 200. "It was an Infiniti plant in the back of my car.

"I had a secret weapon behind me." In a thrilling Indy Racing League

inaugural for Kansas Speedway, Cheever passed Sam Hornish Jr. with slightly more than two laps to go for his first victory of the season.

"The Infiniti engine is finally where we want it to be. We've worked hard for the past three years," Cheever said.

The 1998 Indianapolis 500 winner owns his own car and receives backing from Infiniti, but is racing without a major sponsor — "a situation that has to change," he said. It was the third straight second-place

finish for Hornish, the IRL points leader. He took the lead from Cheever on the 191st of 200 laps on the 1 1/2mile oval, but Cheever regained it approaching the fourth turn on the 198th. His margin of victory of .1976 seconds was the fifth-closest in IRL history.

"It was side-by-side racing — he gave me room, I gave him room," said Hornish, who leads Buddy Lazier by 60 points in the standings. "I like racing with guys like Eddie, because you know they're not going to do something to put you into the wall.'

Cheever called it "the funnest race

"What I love about racing with Sam is that Sam plays by the rules," Cheever said. "He understands that if you have a run on him, he'll give you a hard time, but he'll hold his line. I did that with him and we reciprocated several times.

"He came up with nine laps to go. It would have been very easy for me to shut the door on him and start weaving. But he had treated me correctly the

whole race and I did the same with him.

Cheever also won at Pikes Peak last year with an Infiniti-powered car, but a succession of crashes this season had kept him out of Victory Lane and out of the top 10 in the points standings. 'We' ve never been right there at the

end," said Cheever, whose fifth IRL victory prevented series champion Lazier from becoming only the second driver to win three consecutive events on the circuit. Donnie Beechler was third, fol-

lowed by Felipe Giaffone, Lazier, Airton Dare, Eliseo Salazar, Shigeaki Hattori, and Billy Boat McGehee was racing for the first

time since he broke his left leg, cracked a rib and got a concussion in a crash June 9 at Texas Motor Speedway.




